Unification

OVERBROOK HISTORY

The Missouri Pacific Railroad preceded the building of Overbrook. The children of the first inhabitants attended the old 112 district school on the corner one mile west of Overbrook. The first Overbrook High School opened in the Grange Hall, September 1898, with forty pupils, S. A. McCracken as principal and the faculty.

In January 1919, the entire school building was sacrificed to hungry flames. School opened in the present building in September 1920. In the school year of 1951-52, the building of the gymnasium and shop room was finished.

Through the years Overbrook High School has placed among the best high schools in northeast Kansas.

SCRANTON HISTORY

The graduating class of 1966 was the last to receive diplomas from Scranton High School. It became a part of USD 434 on July 1, 1966, with Carbondale and Overbrook.

The first school in Scranton was a frame building erected in 1872. The first high school class graduated from a second frame building in 1894. The present building was built in three sections as the need for space and facilities

The first section was erected in 1914 and consisted of the south portion. The central part was added in 1930. The last section, consisting of the new gymnasium and remodeling of the second section, was accomplished in 1954

The class of 1966, like the class of 1894, went out into the world to further their education, to become useful citizens and to reflect credit on Scranton High School.

CARBONDALE HISTORY

Carbondale High School opened in 1895. The school has

operated in different buildings under different names.

Rowley, the first public school, was a small building on Carbon Hill. The district was divided into Carbondale and Badger schools. The first school built in the city in 1872 burned in 1898 and was replaced by a red two-story brick

This building was wrecked in 1939, and a buff colored brick building was erected on the present site. Additional classrooms were built in 1958 and 1962 due to over crowded

The high school had two publications: "Carbondale Chatter, " a mimeographed school newspaper and "Viking," the school yearbook.

The latest change in Carbondale schools was the unification of Carbondale, Overbrook and Scranton known as USD 434. A new chapter in education is being written.



The three schools became USD 434 on July 1, 1966 by an act of the Kansas Legislature.





Assistant editors from Overbrook and Scranton are seniors Karen Bevitt and Kay Morgan, respectively.

Each school added its own staff members for various duties. Carbondale staff members include Virginia Armstrong, Patty Patterson, Eda Shogren, and Robert Collinge. Carol White assisted at Overbrook. Due to the resignation of Kay Morgan at Scranton, a new assistant editor was chosen, Nancy Uhl. Her staff members are

Martha Cronn and Connie Weeks.

The yearbook division of the Journalism Workshop, June 6-11, was attended at Manhattan by Miss Harmon, Karen Bevitt, Kay Morgan and Patty Patterson. The June 8 tornado passed through the campus but did not damage the buildings being used by the workshop members.

It was on the campus that the name TRIANGLE evolved from discussions by the three girls. The workshop attendants returned with basic knowledge, new ideas and a

modern look at yearbook trends.

The selling of advertising began in late June and continued through the first semester of school. Ads were sold in Topeka, Lyndon, Osage City, Burlingame, Overbrook, Scranton and Carbondale. A total of 367 miles was traveled. Letters were mailed to school suppliers for ads; several answers were profitable.

There were obstacles to overcome, and the distance between the towns was only one problem. School hours did not allow for working together on the yearbook; several


Saturdays were spent in earnest endeavor.
