## Season of Fulfillment

The Santa Fe Trail track team had a very fine year considering being plagued by injury and sickness at critical stages in our season. The Varsity, made up of Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors, participated in 9 meets and won 3. Good leadership was shown by our fine, hardworking captain Stan Herrmann and cocaptains Cliff Barnhart and Rob Land.

This was the first year for our all-weather track facility in which it received a more-than-adequate initiation with 5 meets being held on it. Santa Fe Trail won 4 of these meets.

As a team the Chargers gathered 150 medals and eleven trophies this season. Three meet records were broken by SFT in the Burlingame Invitational.
