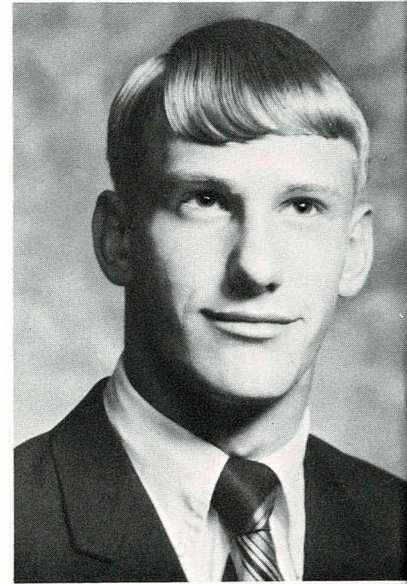
Seniors last year best!

The Class of '71 entered the halls of SFT ready to lead the Chargers in everything.

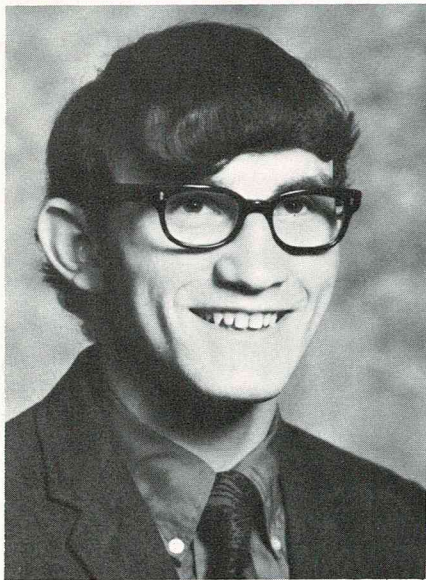
They led the varsity teams with returning lettermen and showed the underclassmen how it's done with sportsmanship and team work.

It was a very important year for the Class of '72, and one they'd surely never forget.

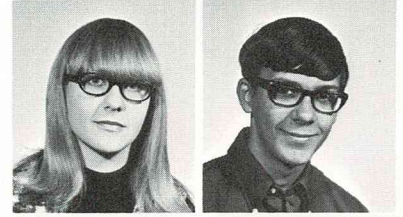

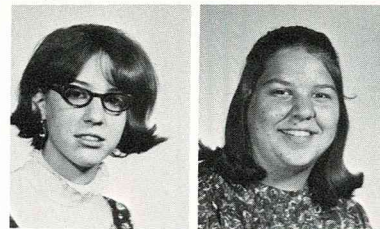
Freshmen adjust to school life

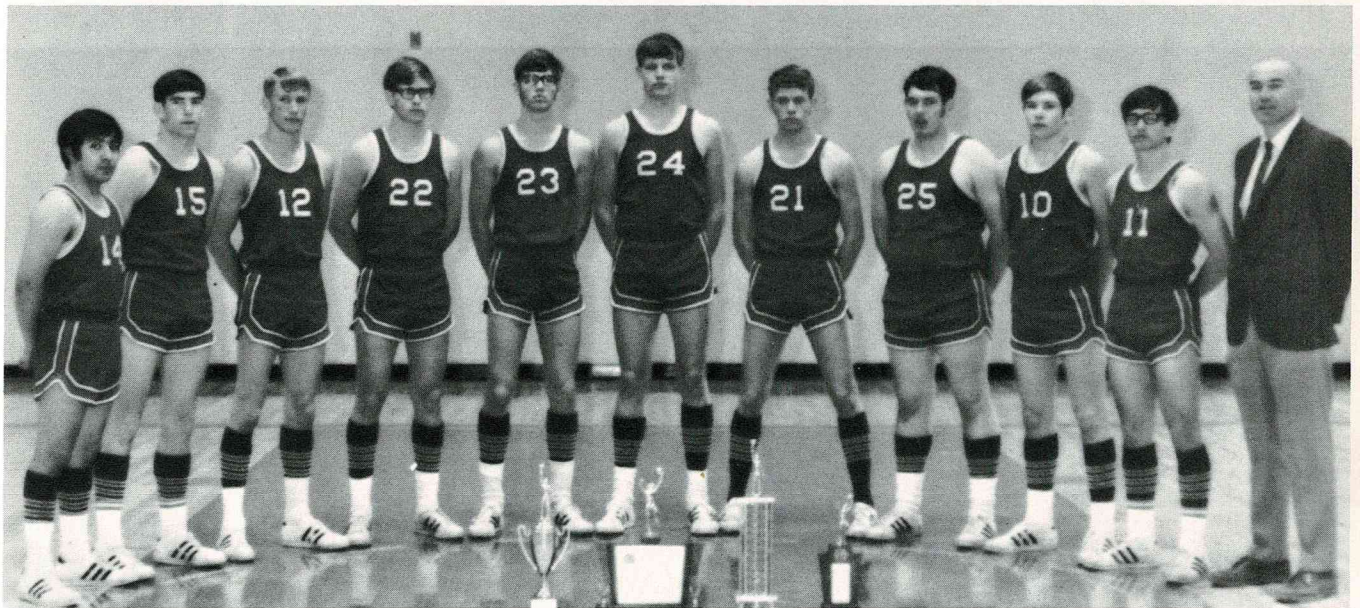
We played great championship games against Yates Center in the Baldwin tournament and against Lyndon in the district finals at Lyndon.

Regardless of the type of honor the boys received, we think well of all of them and will remember them individually and as a team.

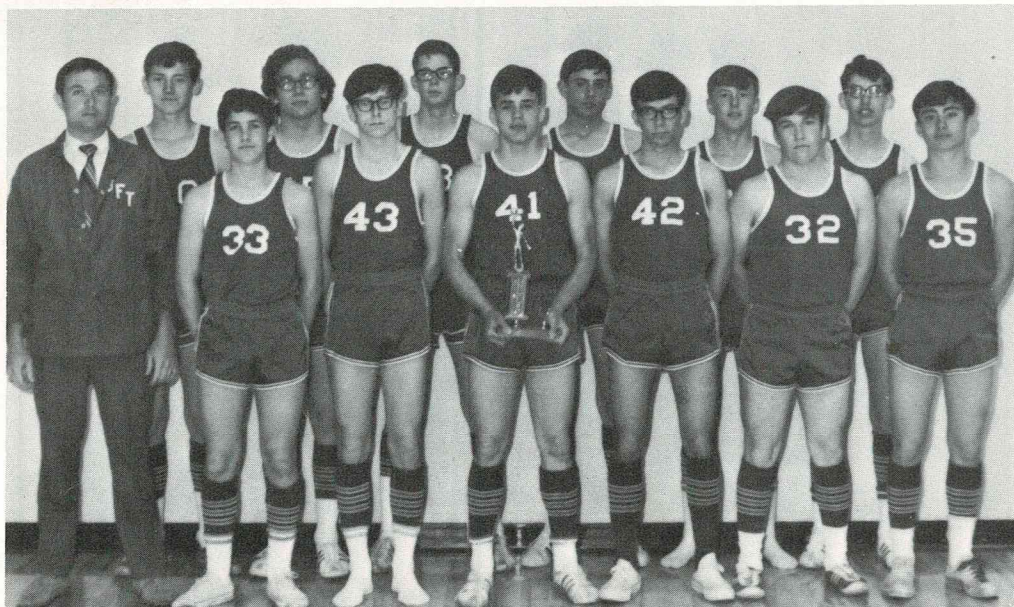
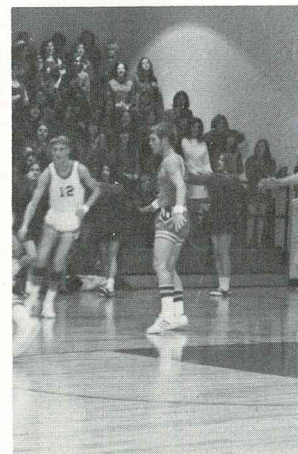
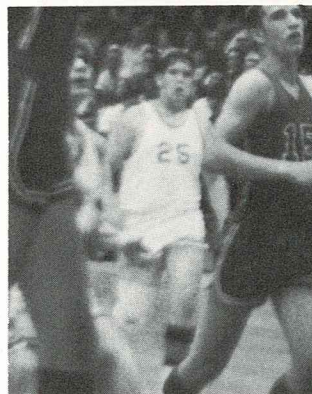

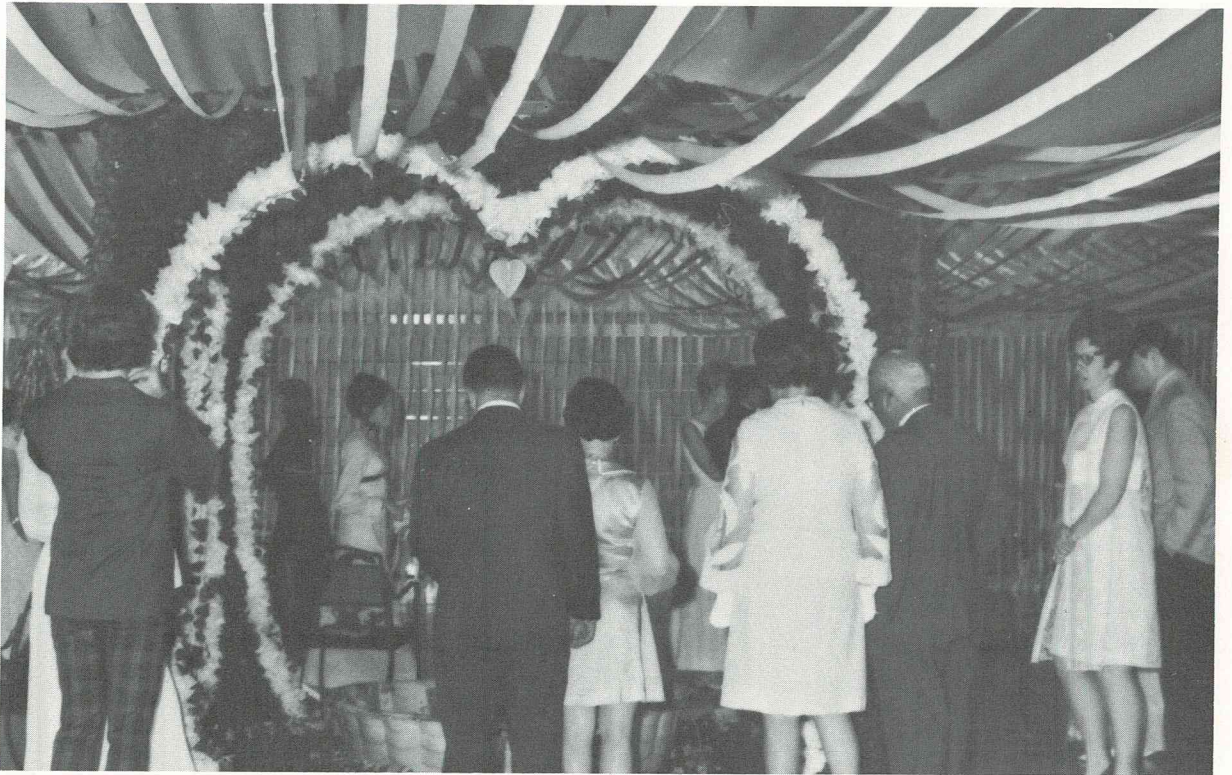
The banquet, served by select Sophomores, was said to be the best in several years. The food was excellent and the program entertaining.

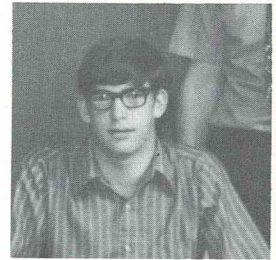
The student body, headed by Stan Herrmann, elected these members of the Student Council to do their work.

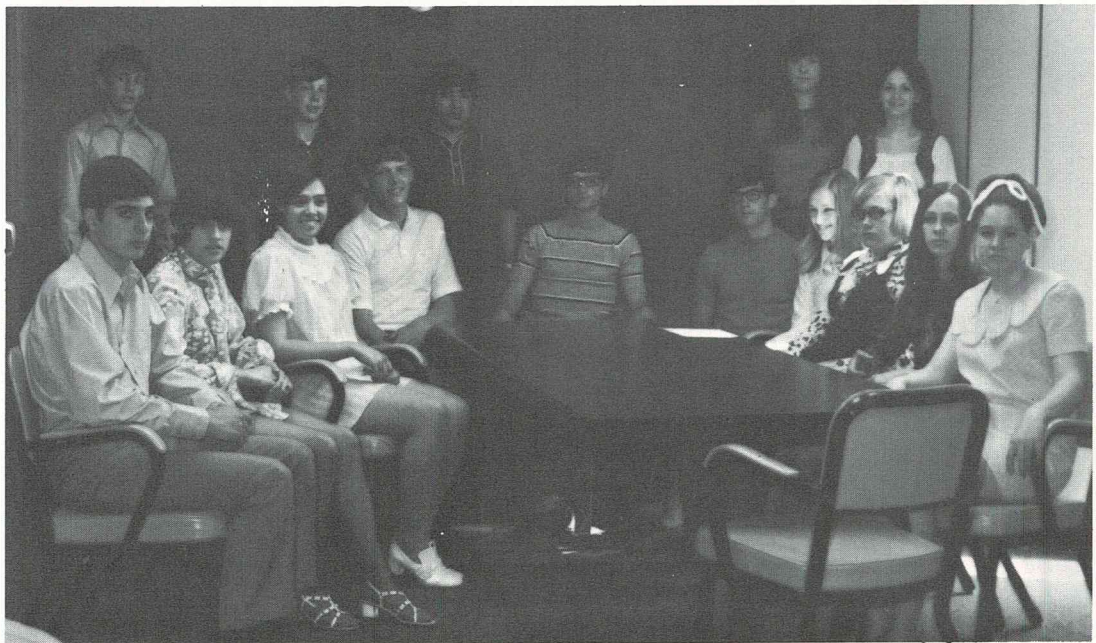

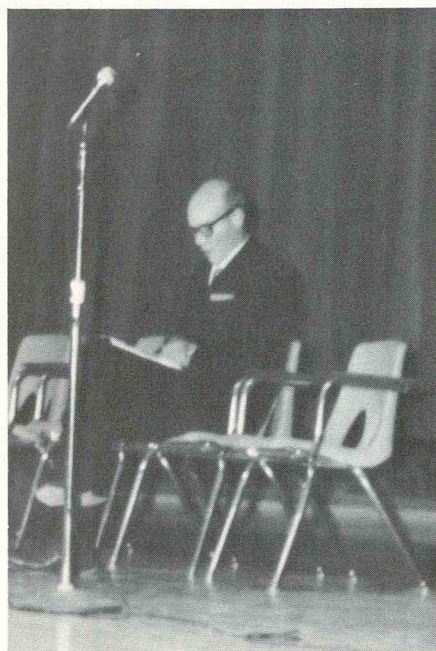
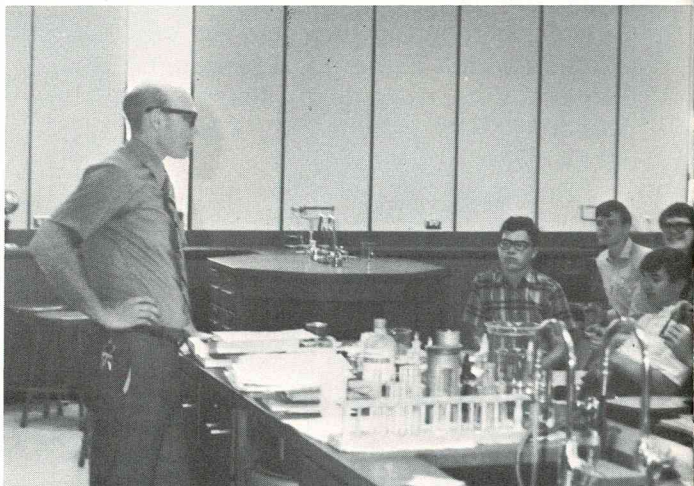
The Kays, though small in number, accomplished many important deeds this year. They started off the year by cohosting the United Conference with the Kayettes.

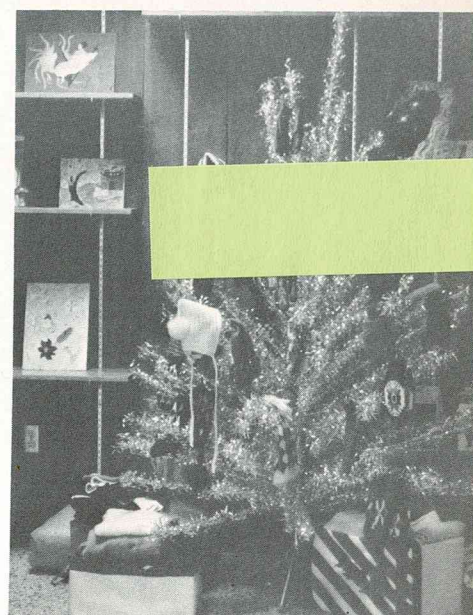

They sold concessions at home football and basketball games and sold buttons supporting, "Charger Homecoming '70" in October.

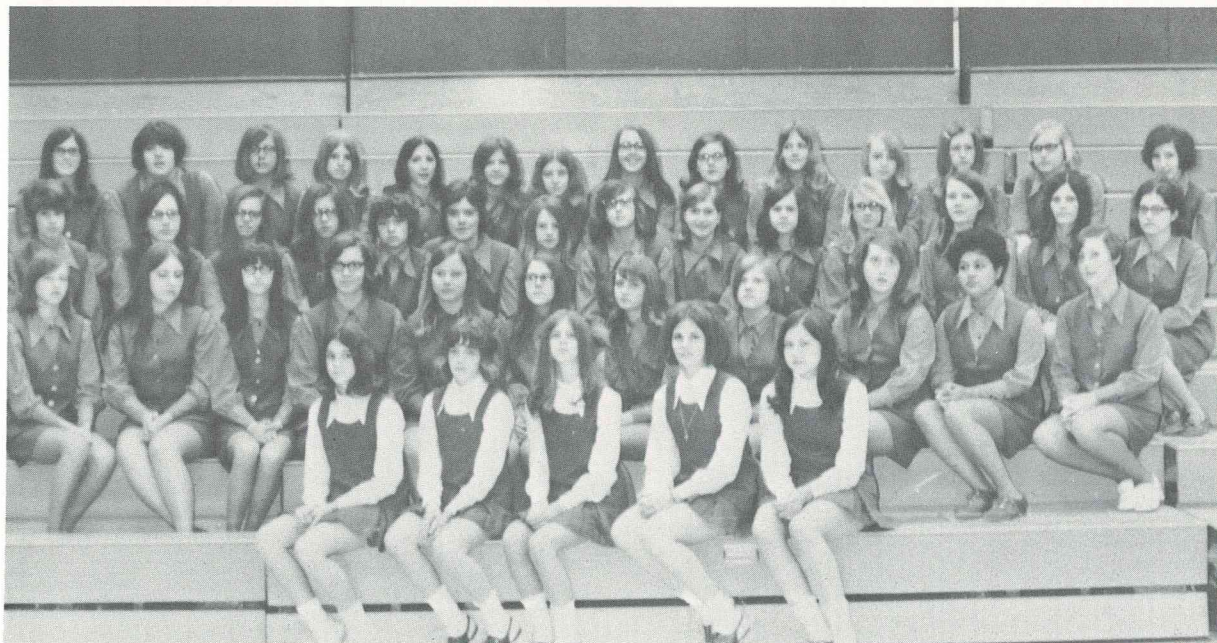
