The 1976-1977 basketball season was a very successful one from all aspects. The basketball squad, composed mostly of seniors went through through their league schedule without a defeat, making them the Jayhawk League champions. This included a double overtime victory against Blue Valley-Stanley, overtime wins over Louisburg and Basehor and narrow victories over Spring Hill and Wellsville.

In a very tough non-league sched-
ule, the Chargers defeated Olathe, a large 4-A school, and Holton, a tough 3-A opponent with an impressive won-loss record. One of the major highlights of the season was the first ever varsity victory over Lyndon, ranked in the state at the time in class 2-A. The game played on Lyndon's home floor, ended 46-45 and avenged an earlier loss to the Tigers. The Chargers also played against schools of high caliber such as Atchison, last year's 3-A state
champions, Kansas City-Harmon, 4-A member of the Kansas City Kansas League, and Topeka-Hayden which was a one-point loser to Washburn Rural in the substate tournament. Washburn Rural went on to be the runner-up in 3-A competition on the state level.

The Chargers established two records in the 1976-1977 season. On January 28, 1977, the team made 22 out of 39 shots, establishing a new game field goal percentage at $58 \%$. Overall, the Chargers made 210 of 368 free throws for a team free throw percentage of $57.1 \%$.

The 1976-1977 season was one marked by determination and desire on the part of all participants. The Chargers were represented on the Jayhawk All-League team by two team members, Mi ke Ganger and Rex Sleichter.
