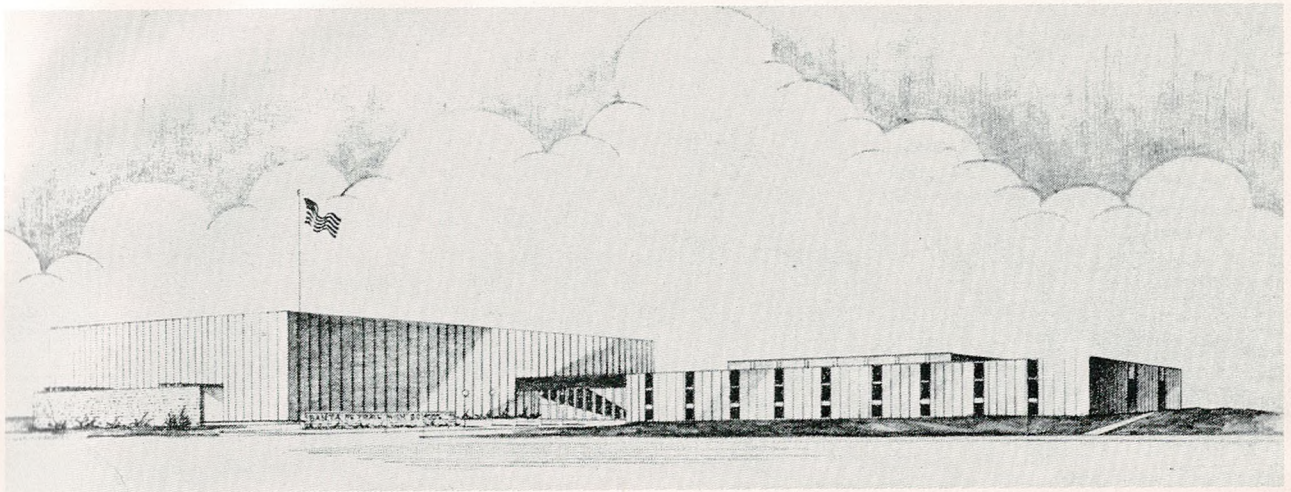



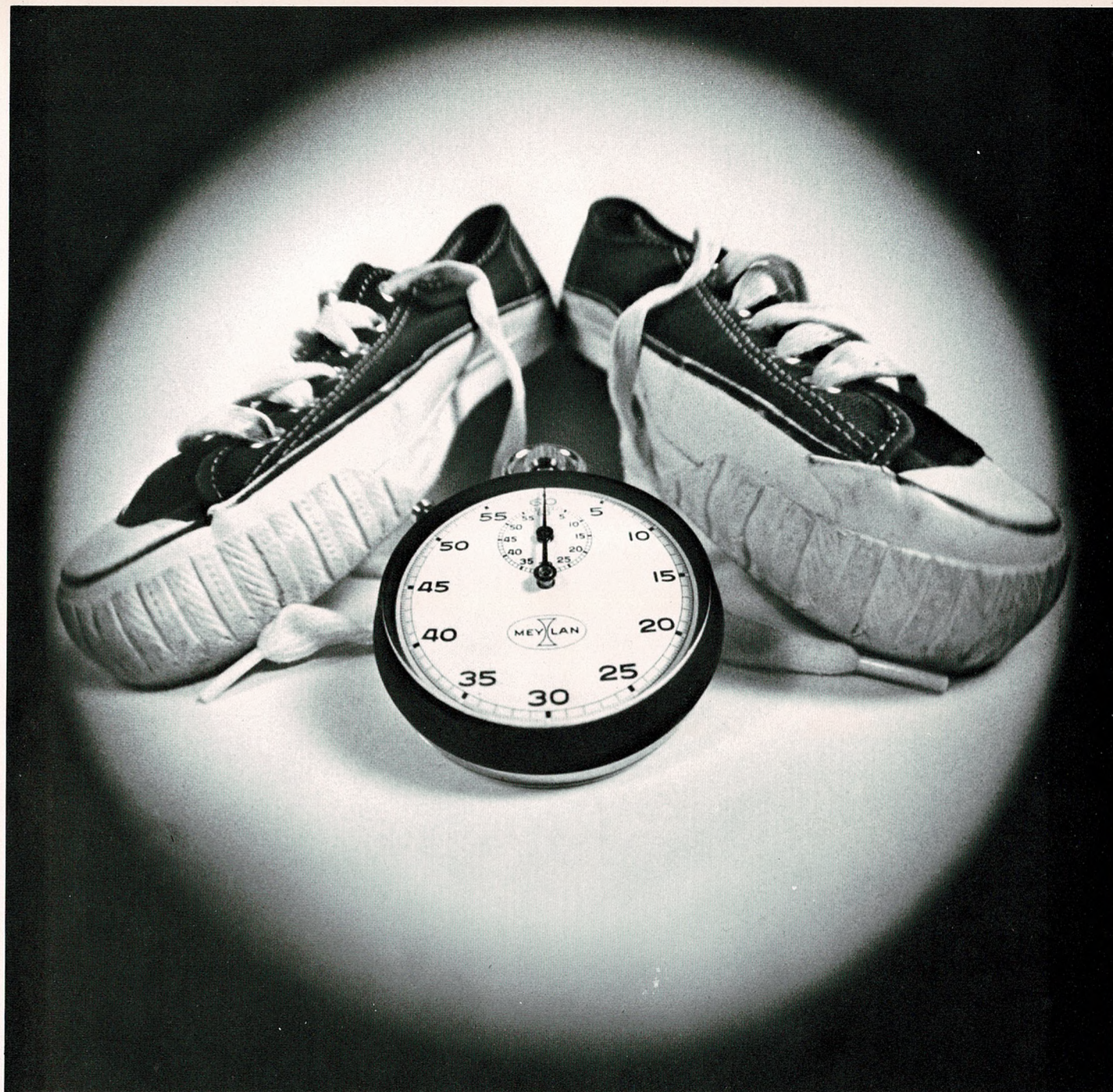


During the past year everyone at Santa Fe Trail High School has been saddened by the death of a teacher and a student.

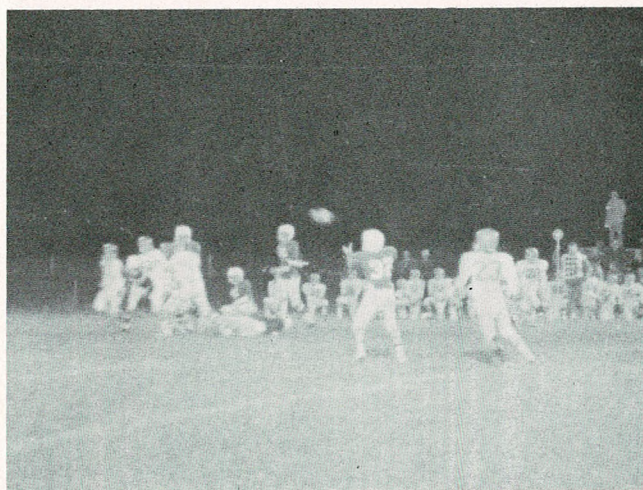

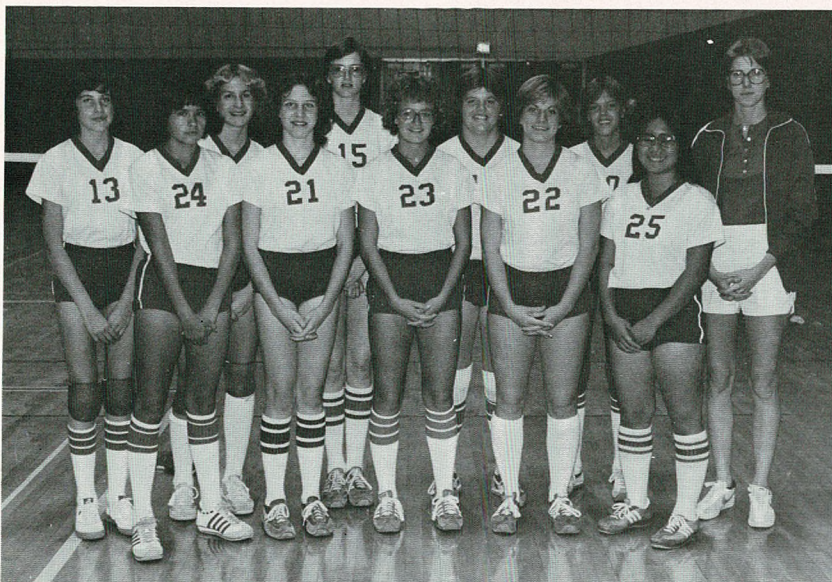

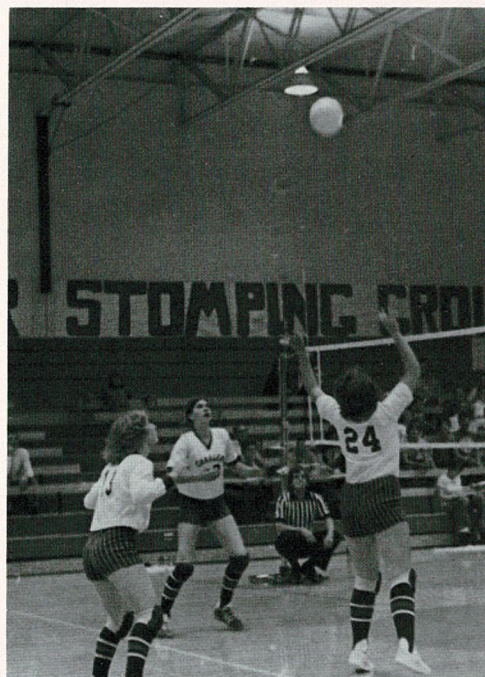
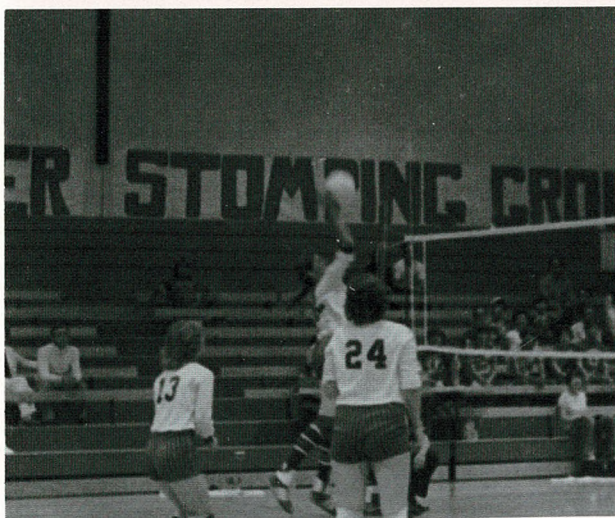

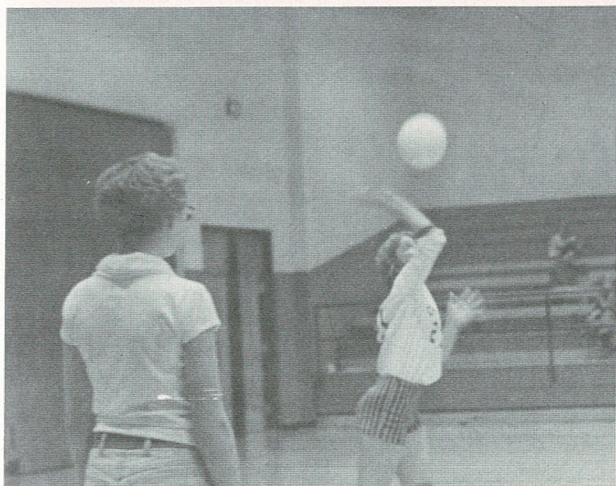

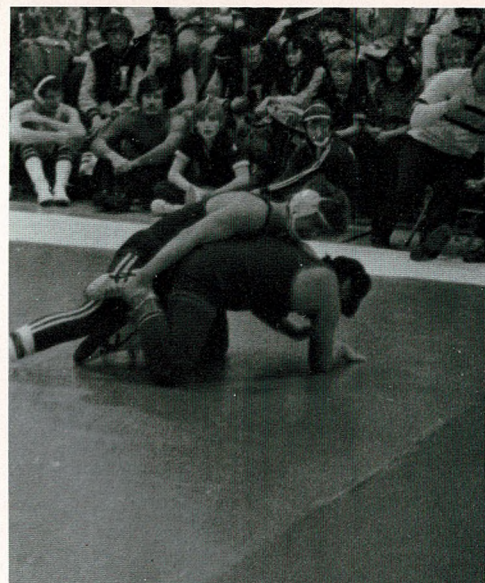
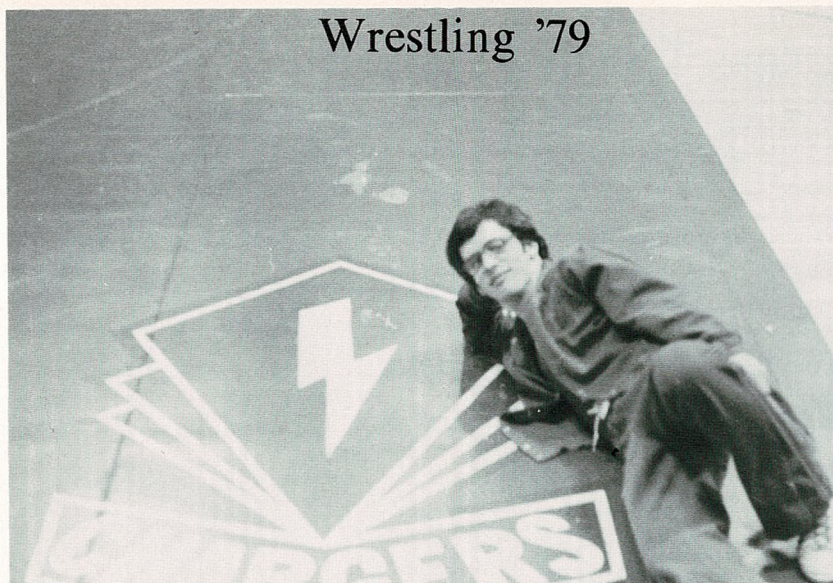

Everywhere We Go

... People want to know, who we are. So we tell them, we are the Chargers, the mighty, mighty Chargers! This is the win chant used by the Charger matmen. They had an 8-6 record for the season, and tied third in the League. The team also broke or tied 7 school records: Gary Fulton scored 31 takedowns, passing Tony Fawl's 1977 mark of 24; Garrett recorded 32 reversals, passing Fawl's 28 in '77; McBurney scored 17 two-point near falls erasing Leo Lang's 11 set in '76; Ganger had 16 three-point near falls passing the mark of 12 set by Lang in '75 and tied by Fawl in '77; Shelton had 16 escapes, 2 more than Schirmer had in '74; Fulton passed Shina-barger's record 235 points scored during '78 up to 265; and Fulton tied the school's fastest pin in 17 seconds also held by Schirmer in '74 and Crow in '76.

Coach Bell pointed out that most of the records were either broken or tied by Junior Wrestlers.

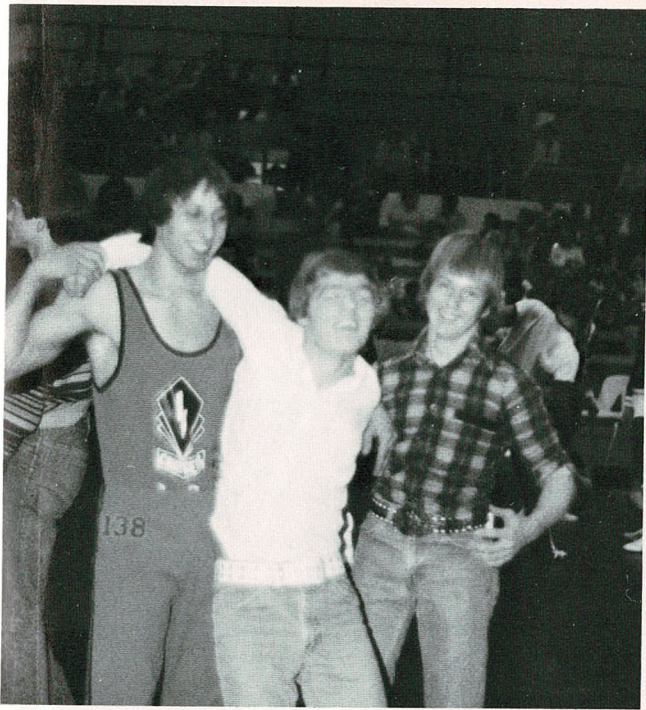

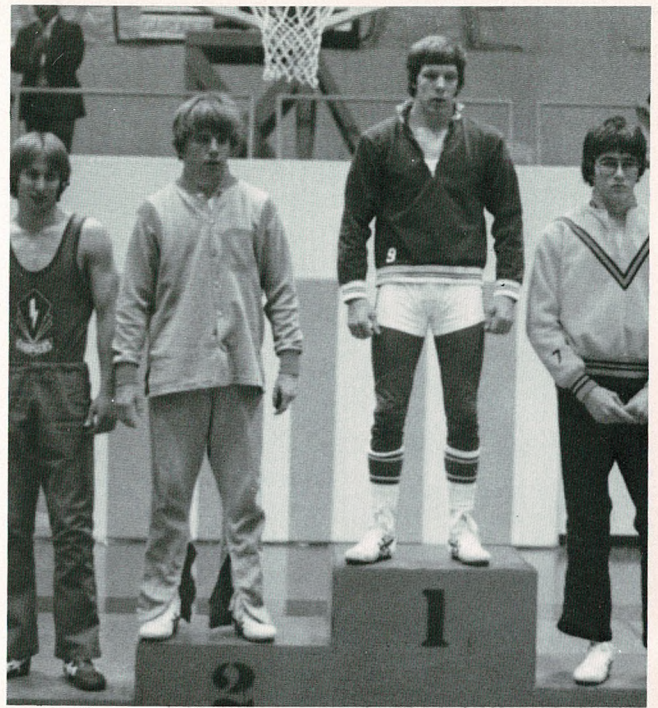

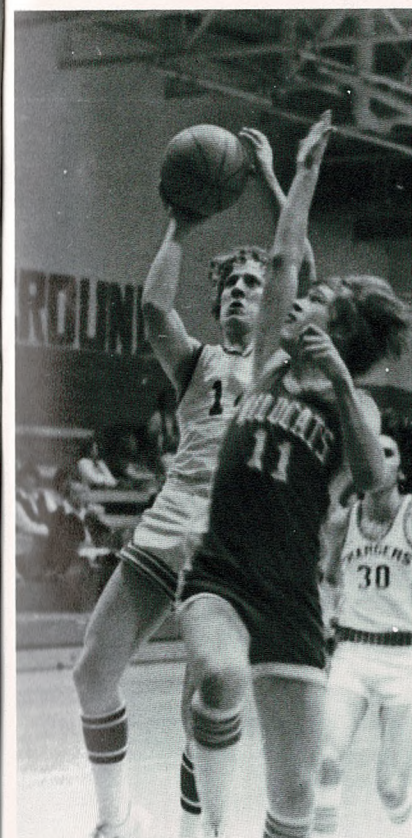

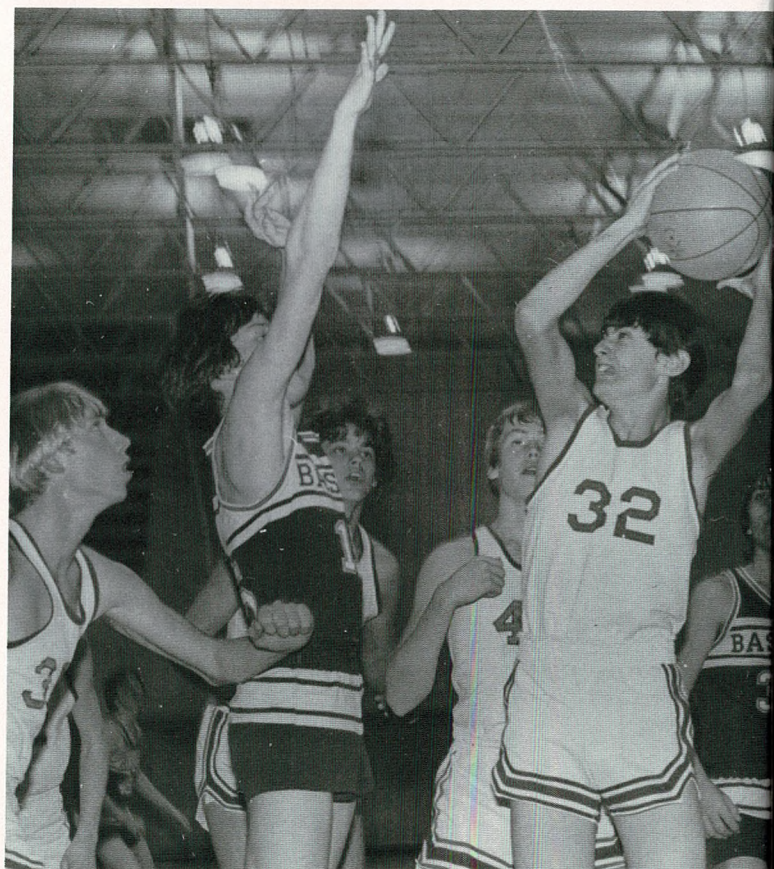
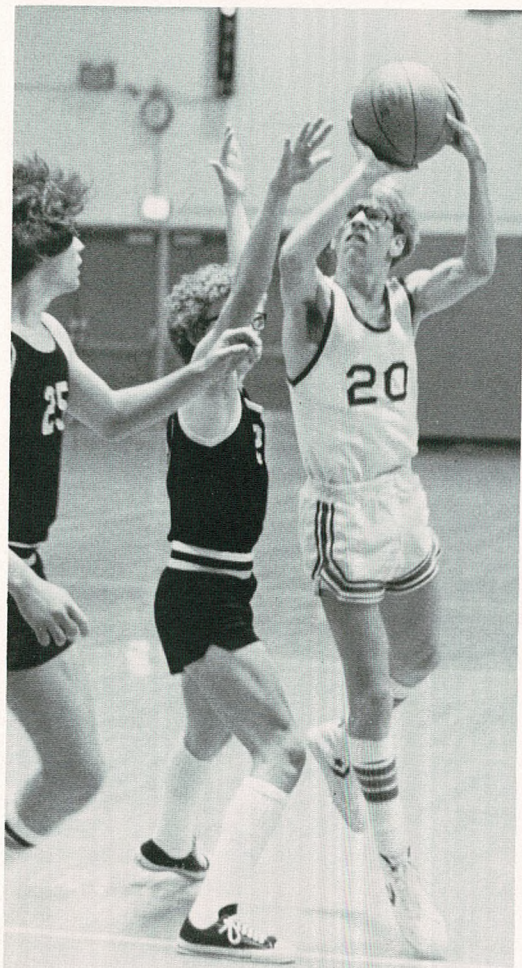

A band provided music for the traditional Homecoming dance that followed the game.

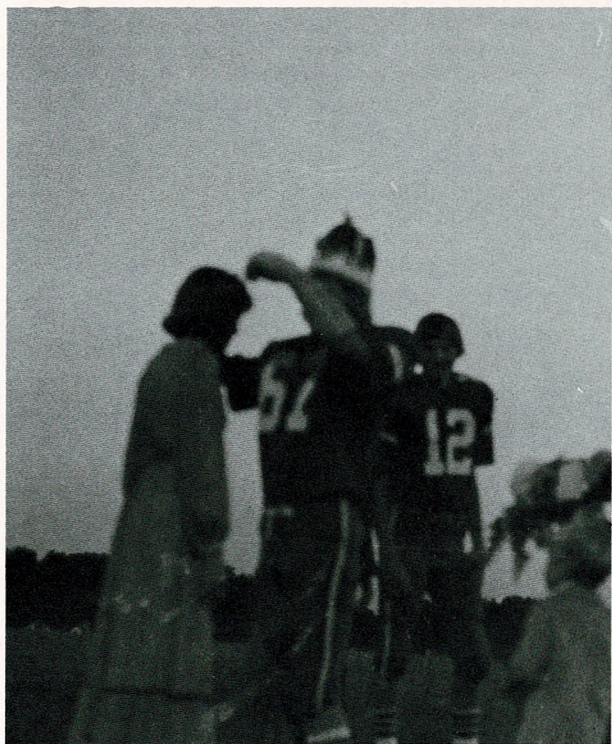

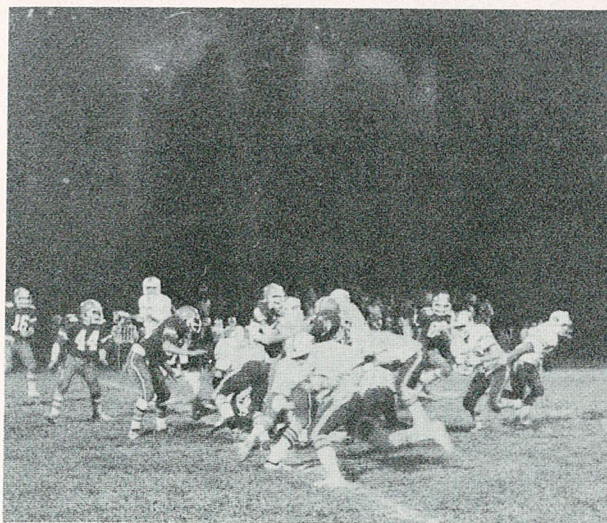

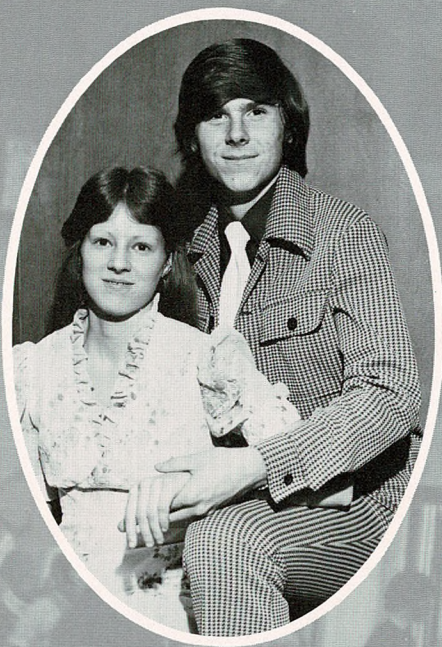

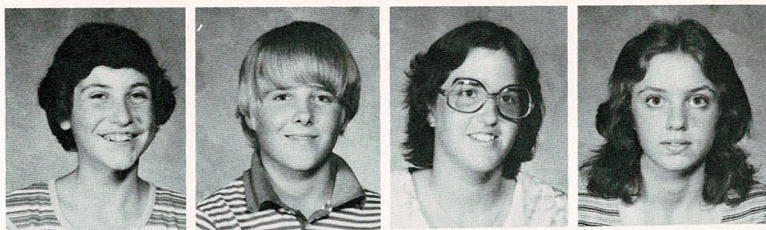


Rookies Take First Step . . . Freshmen

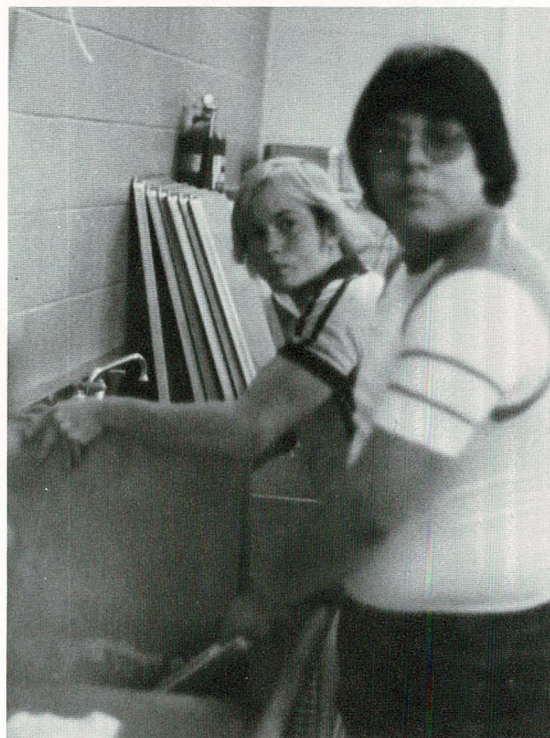
Prom

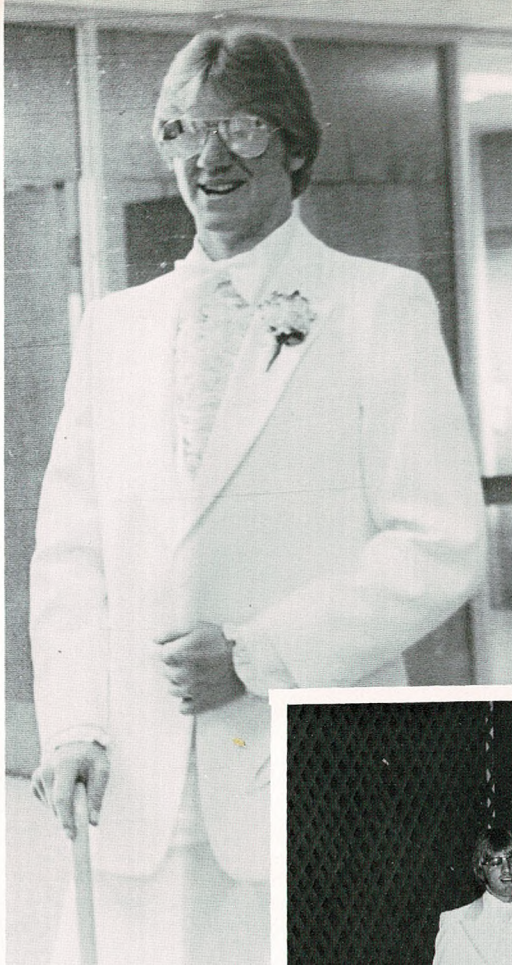

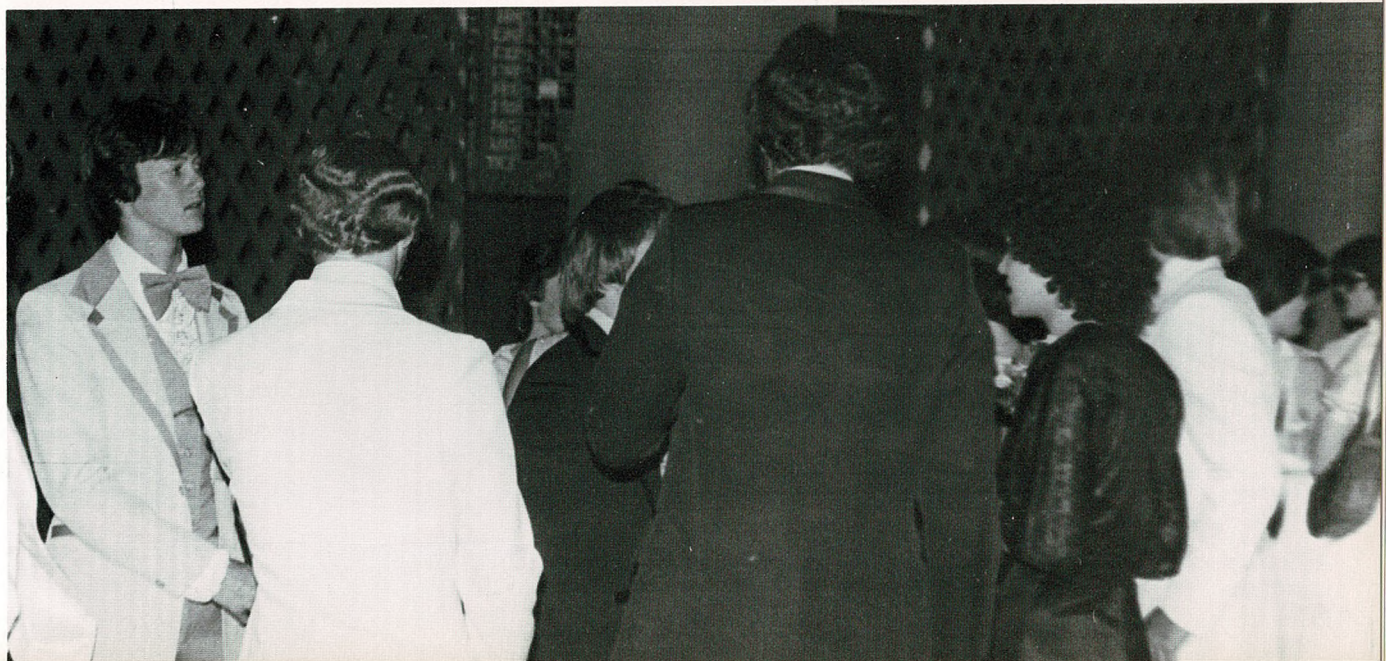

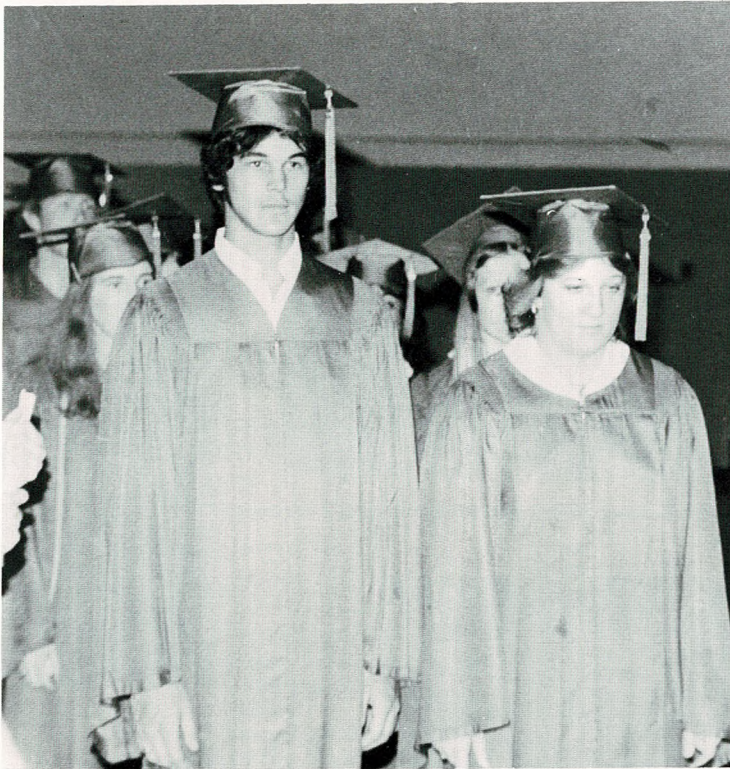

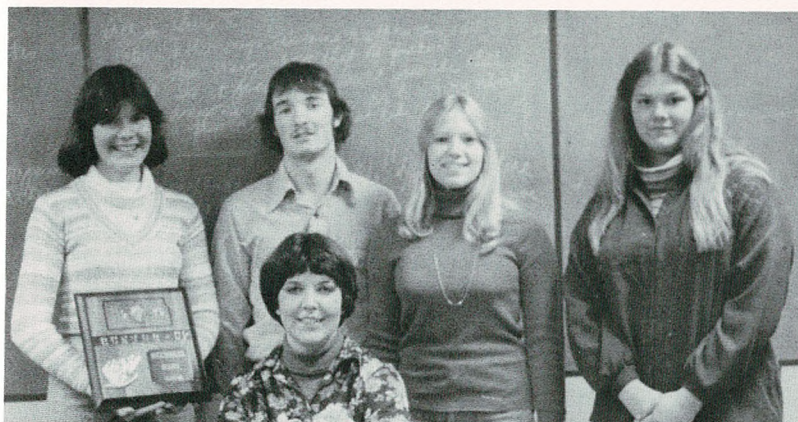

Penny Mellies and DeDe Collins took second place at the Washburn Rural Tournament.

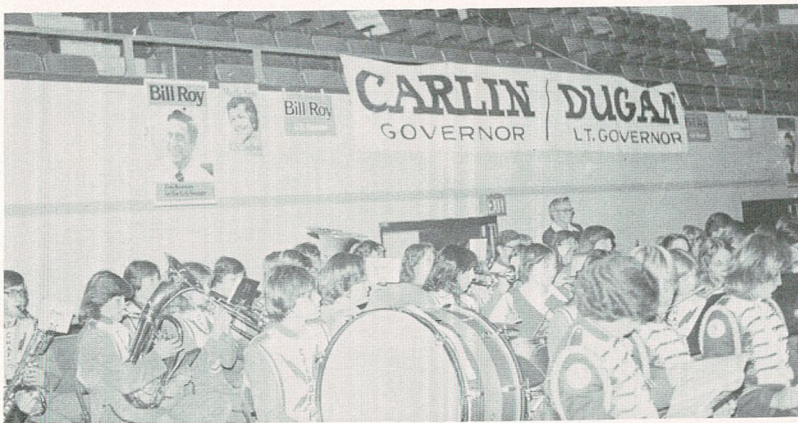

League festival for the combined choruses took place at Blue Valley this year. It was a tiring but thrilling experiance to sing in such a mass choir.

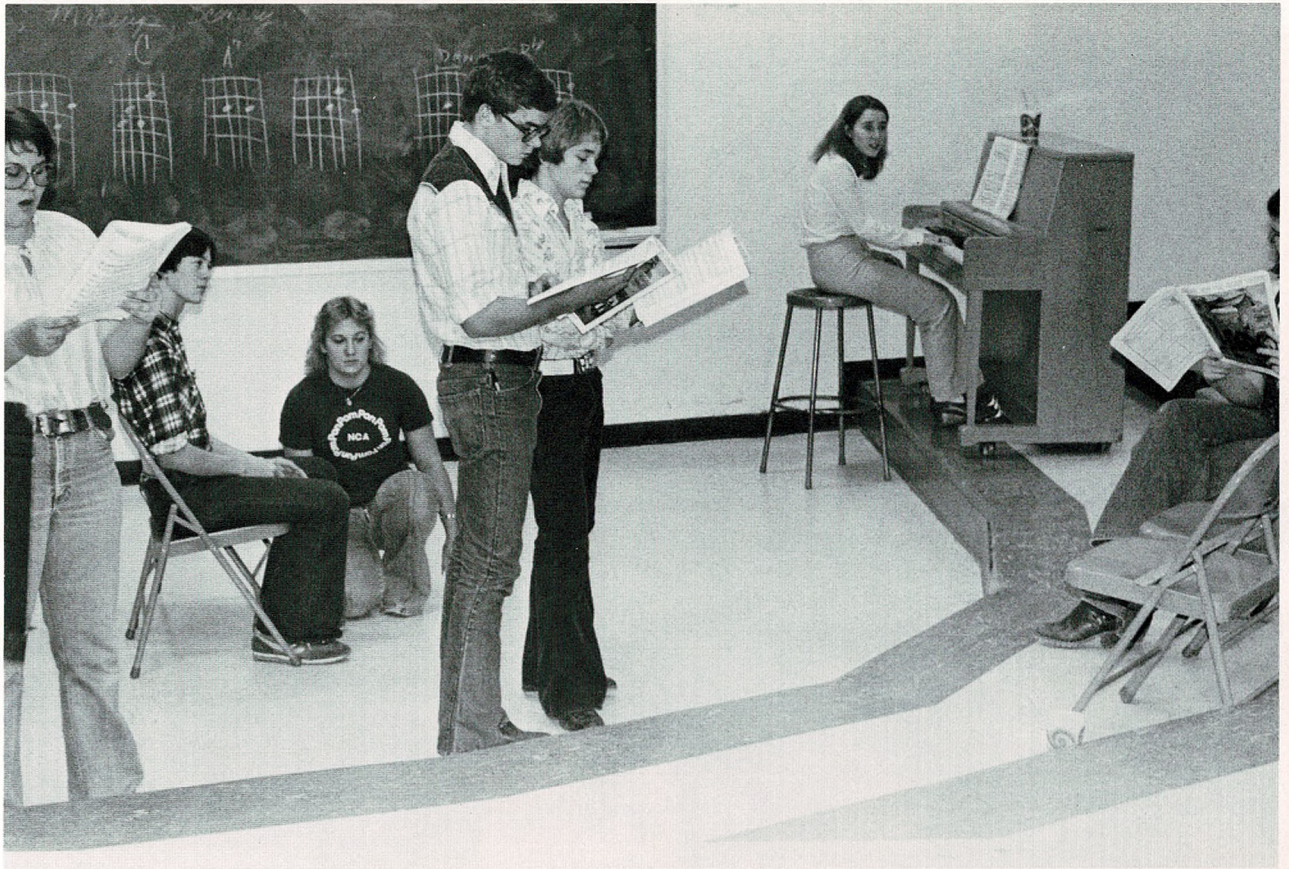
